Throughout middle and high school commit to...


- Attending Open House, Orientation, College Awareness, and Transition Evening events;
- Communicating with teachers using email, phone, and/or student organizer;
- Scheduling meetings with your child's teachers and counselors;
- Developing a plan to help your child self prepare for exams throughout the school year;
- Insisting your child seek extra help outside of class;
- Reviewing the progress reports and report cards with your child;
- Encouraging extracurricular activities and hobbies;
- Emphasizing the importance and benefits of community service;
- Promoting reading for pleasure;
- Visiting Family Connection in Naviance frequently to stay updated.
- Visiting the Guidance Web pages for a wealth of information and various links

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- Get to know your Guidance Counselor to help with transition, scheduling and academic support.
- Kick off your college exploration by participating in Scholar Shirt Day.
- Attend Kid's Talk to discuss careers, colleges, and learn organizational and study skills.
- Learn and explore Road Trip Nation!!
- Meet with your Guidance Counselor to register for Family Connection in Naviance.
- Participate in Career Day activities to explore the world of work and opportunities.
- Join afterschool clubs and activities including Intramural Sports and Homework Club.

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- Continue using Family Connection in Naviance to:
 - Further develop career exploration using resume writing, occupational searches and Career Cluster Finder.
 - Discover your preferences by taking the Learning Style Inventory.
- Get involved in extracurricular activities such as student council, academic and special interest clubs, peer support and performing arts.
- Strengthen your grade point average and obtain your Gold Card to be eligible for competitive sports.



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Visit college campuses as part of summer plans and check on entrance requirements. Utilize Naviance to explore at least ten careers using the Career Key and investigate higher education through SuperMatch College Search saving at least tenpue	<)-1

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- Use Family Connection in Naviance to complete the Personality Survey "Do What You Are," the Career Interest Profiler and update your activities in the Resume Builder.
- Register for PSAT review classes in the fall.
- Interpret your PSAT results in the spring by using the online code provided on your Score Report to access "My Quickstart" on CollegeBoard.com to learn about your strengths and weaknesses.
- Don't be afraid to step outside of your comfort zone and get involved in a new club or sport.
- Visit college campuses and attend college fairs whenever possible.
- Keep the momentum going! Remain committed to your academics. Reach out for help when you need it. Speak with your counselor to try to strike a healthy balance between your schoolwork, your co-curricular activities, your responsibilities at home, etc.


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- Register for PSAT review classes in the fall to prepare ٠ for the exam in October. Utilize your score report to prepare for upcoming SAT exam.
- Use Naviance to explore careers that interest you, conduct college searches and investigate colleges of interest. Explore Road Trip Nation at length!
- Look for specific leadership opportunities to enhance your resume.
- Schedule a Junior Conference in winter/spring to discuss the following:
 - Post-graduate plans
 - Transcript review
 - Prospective colleges/majors
 - Possible essay topics for college applications
 - Academic progress/Take the SAT & ACT
- Perform a follow-up college search on Naviance that • reflects current interests and personalized criteria.
- Attend Open Houses on college campuses as often as possible.

- Schedule an appointment with your Guidance Counselor early in the fall semester to launch the college application process.
- Create accounts on CommonApp.org, SUNY.edu, CUNY.edu and/or college-specific websites to apply.

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- Contact individual admissions offices for college-specific information, as requirements change from year to year.
- Check your Naviance account regularly for information regarding scholarships, on-site admissions dates, visits from college representatives and other important messages.
- Review your plan for college entrance exams.
- Be mindful of testing and college application deadlines. Make every effort to submit all completed applications before the New Year.
- The Guidance Department requires a minimum of ten school days to process college applications.
- Plan to file your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) after January 1st. Individual financial aid appointments are available for parents and families through the Guidance Office.
- Complete the CSS Profile if necessary. Check individual college websites for Financial Aid filing deadlines.
- Review college acceptance and financial aid award letters at home and with your counselor.
- Commit to your chosen college by sending in your deposit by its required deadline.
